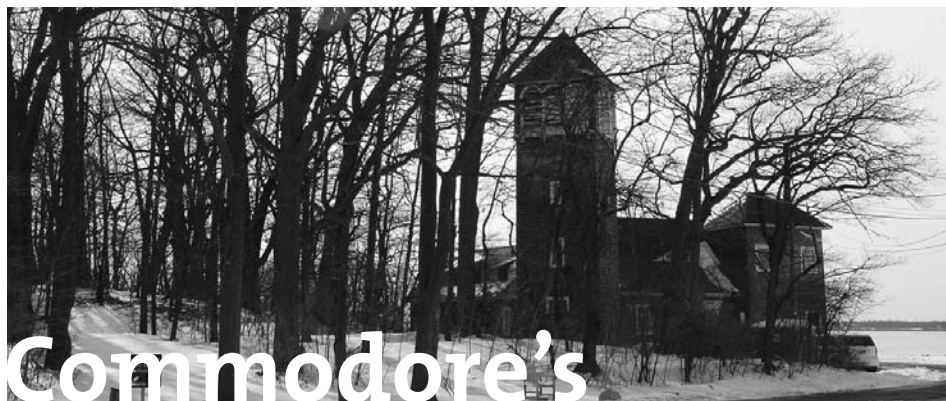

Announcing the eBoathouse

With the success of the frequent emails last year and website being kept up to-date, the publishers of the Boathouse decided to re-think how best to deliver Club information to you. Even though the Boathouse was published monthly, it contained the same content as the website. Packaged nicely into one edition it could be printed out at home, posted to the website, and copies made available at the Club House. It also served as an archive of our activities for those of us who like to see what year that cruise occurred or when a By-law change was made.



The question we asked is how best to utilize a combination of e-mail, website and classic Boathouse to best serve the membership and keep duplicate efforts to a minimum?

Your publishers have arrived at this mix.

- The Boathouse will be published four times a year, once per season and when there is a special need as called for in the By-Laws. It will contain snap shots of past activities and announce key future events. Past issues will continue to be archived on the website.
- The eBoathouse will be published as emails no more than once a week. It will contain timely information of upcoming events and other topical news. Past emails will be archived under the “Boathouse” selection in the “Members Only” section of the website.
- The website will increasingly serve as a repository of past events and a place for members to post announcements and share experiences. For example, E. Don Smith’s cruise report and others that members turn in will be posted to the Cruise section of the website.

At the end of the day, you can expect improved communications in 2011. This will be achieved by an integrated approach between the Boathouse, eBoathouse and the website. Taken together you should have every opportunity to be informed. Be sure the email address in your member profile is up-to-date.

This is also a time for you to consider joining the publishing team—report on a boating event or share a personal experience—and join the fun. No contribution is too small.

The Boathouse, the newsletter of the Old Greenwich Yacht Club, is published quarterly and as necessary. eBoathouse e-mail blasts to all members are published approximately once a week. The season begins with sailfleet readiness work parties. Anyone interested in the sailing fleet is welcome to volunteer to get the boats ready for the 2011 season.

Readiness parties are from 9am to 12pm on Saturday April 9, 16, 23, 30.

Many hands are needed to launch the sailfleet. The Ideal 18 fleet launch date is scheduled for Saturday April 30th from 9am-12pm (high tide is at 10:30am).

May 2011

Low water tide tours will be given to any member of the club that is interested in learning where the hazards areas are in Captain Harbor. This tour is mandatory for any member that wants to use the OGYC sailfleet as part of the checkout program as it will identify the sailfleet boundaries. These dates are shown on the club calendar.

The Mercury fleet launch date is scheduled for Saturday May 21st at 2:30pm (high tide). Many hands needed for this date.

Users of the OGYC sailfleet MUST attend 1 or 2 mandatory sailors meetings scheduled for Sunday May 15 from 1-2:30pm and May 22 from 10-11:30pm. This is an important meeting that sailfleet users must attend. We will review the sailfleet agreement, the new sailfleet certification process, and review all sailfleet program events for 2011.

June-August

This year the sailfleet certification program will take place on Saturday mornings. Sail fleet certification will be done by Greenwich Community sailing and will take place from 9:30am to 12pm in June, July, and August. There is a member limit of 6 people on 2 boats per session. It may be possible to run more than 1 session each morning. Family members including children over 9 years of age are welcome to build their skills with a GCS US sailing certified instructor. Sailfleet certification is for members over 18 years of age. Registration is required 1 week in advance and can be done by using the learning forum to do so. This will be reviewed at the mandatory sailors meeting.

Saturday morning mentoring will also take place from 9:30 to 11:30am. This is a great way to go out with an experienced member of the club to learn about sailing, club sailing activities, and basic knowledge of the sailfleet. Mentoring consists of short sails in and around the harbor. Sign up in advance using the learning forum. Please contract me to be a volunteer mentor.

Sunday afternoon race seminars. These seminars begin at

12:30pm and end before fleet racing on Sunday afternoons. Anyone is welcome to attend. Seminars last about 1 hour in the clubhouse. No reservations necessary. The first seminar will take place Sunday May 22nd.

Highlights:

Race Management Seminars, May 14 and May 21

This seminar will highlight all race management functions for starting, finishing, and scoring PHRF races as well as one-design. Please attend one of these seminars if you are assisting on a Race Committee for any date this season.

PHRF Vespers Start on Wednesday, May 18

Weekly racing for PHRF rated boats is on Wednesday evenings at 1900 in Captain Harbor. Three starts for three divisions covering the latest racing machines to the antique cruiser. All divisions are non-spinnaker.

YRA One-Design Races Start on Sunday, May 22

On Sunday afternoons, Ideal 18s, Lasers and Etchells are raced on longer courses where three of four races are sailed over two to three hours. We are joined by sailors from Riverside YC, Indian Harbor YC and the Belle Haven Club, which brings as many as ten to fifteen Ideal 18s and over twenty Lasers to the starting line. Spinnakers are allowed for any class that uses them.

Now if only it were Tom Hanks or Meg Ryan sending you that member invoice...

Member billing for club and inter club charges... ahem, ahem... clearly we did not do enough last year to get the word out about switching member billing from snail mail to email. ALL member bills are now sent out by email in a pdf format from OGYC's long-time bookkeeper, Paula. The emailed invoice is not a "preview of coming attractions" with the real bill to follow by old fashioned paper mail. The emailed invoice is the ONLY invoice you will receive. If you are unable to download pdf files please contact Kim Crocco, our Membership Director, for assistance.

If you plan on incurring member charges this year, whether reciprocal charges at another club or ice on a hot day from the clubhouse, the bill for those charges will be sent to the email address in your member profile on the club website. So... please make sure the email address in your member profile is one you check regularly; that your spam filter is not sending club emails to the "dead letter box"; and, when you do receive an email with a member invoice, please print it and pay it at your earliest convenience.

All that said, we have a little clean-up to do at our end to make the process work better this year. Last year we stopped emailing

invoices at the end of the summer and did not continue through the fall. That resulted in a backlog of charges that went out at the end of the year which strained folks' memories. Thank you for your patience and my apologies for the backlog. That was entirely my error. I did not realize the number of member charges incurred during the fall. This year we will send out bills monthly through the end of the year. Likewise, there were some emails that went awry at our end, and ended up in a virtual never-never land and not in your inbox. We don't know exactly what happened, but once membership renewal season is behind us, Kim Crocco and I will try to figure out the technical glitch and have an improved system before summer.

Finally, there have been several requests for additional detail on charges incurred at other clubs. Unfortunately most clubs only send us the date, the member's name and the total amount incurred. We do not get copies of the "chit" for your expenses. It's not all that different from a credit card bill, for example, the monthly bill states how much you charged at the hardware store, but not whether you bought a hammer or a box of nails. It's up to you to keep the detailed receipt and check that the amount billed to your credit card matches the store receipt. This is the same process for member charges so please keep your receipts from the club you visited if you wish to ensure accuracy in the amount subsequently billed to you.

Thanks to all of you who renewed on time this year. We welcome you back and look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at the spring members meeting on April 16th.



Cruiser's Log, Our Passage South

Cruise Report: E.Don Smith

INTRODUCTION

E.Don Smith and wife Eileen have been fulltime cruisers for 8 years. After a lifetime of owning sailboats, they bought "Shangri-La" their Heritage East 36 Sundeck Trawler in 2003. Every fall, while others are decommissioning, they turn her South and head for Florida. While this passage can be done in a few weeks, or even less, they allocate two months in order to savor a beautiful cross-section of America. Having already accrued 25,000 miles of cruising between CT and FL, they have agreed to share this year's adventure in the Spy Glass. Therefore...

SAUGATUCK TO NEW YORK CITY

We left Friday evening 9/24/10 and made it to Old Greenwich arriving by the light of a harvest moon...a good omen for this 1500 mile voyage.

On Saturday 9/26/10, we suffered the anxiety of going through NYC on the East River: Exciting to experience but requiring skill and attention due to the 5 knot current and the traffic. Because the United Nations was in session, there were 7 coast guard ships guarding the area, all with pointed machine guns. One chased us down with flashing lights (and gun), and asked us to travel 175 ft. farther away from the west bank, as we passed the UN building... Unnerving! but glad there is homeland security.

There are always many huge SHIPS in NY Harbor, and we try hard to stay out of their way. As we pass the South Street Sea port, with the gallant old sailing vessels, and approach the ferry landings the traffic intensifies: Ferries, water taxis, launches, police boats, coast guard patrols, cargo barges/tugs, and overhead, helicopters landing and taking off. As we clear the Battery



and go into semi-open water, we then have to weave through moored tankers, and departing/ arriving commercial vessels.

When we passed under the Verazano Bridge and were almost to Sandy Hook, we let our guard down, breathed a sigh of relief and focused straight ahead. Later, we heard this deep, loud, terrifying HORN behind us. We both jumped out of our chairs! We turned around to look behind us and saw a GIANT BOW about to run over us. Yikes! We turned a sharp left and hit the throttle. Lived to see another day!

NAVIGATION:

We use MAPTECH on a lap top computer as we find the large computer screen so much easier to follow than a small Chart Plotter. We chose a SONY VAIO laptop because it has an exceptionally bright screen that is unreadable in direct sunlight. We have a back-up computer fully loaded with Maptech as well. Into our laptop, we plug a cartridge type GPS (without a screen) which feeds Maptech directly: "Compact Flash GPS, Global Sat SiRF III"

We ALWAYS have our paper charts open as well, with stick-on markers showing our present location. We are constantly updating these charts to reflect changes that we observe.
